The EDP&M program deals with the issues and topics pertaining to economic development that constitute the core of socio-economic development. This program trains students to become career development economists or other experts in economic development who can contribute to poverty reduction through economic growth via increased income and employment creation. Facing the multi-dimensional development problems of the 21st century, development economists who are well-versed in New Political Economy—a fusion of politics, economics, and culture—are needed. Economists should consider both traditional and new agents in development, socio-economic institutions and embedded culture in a comprehensive manner to effectively situate economic development in a broad context of socio-economic development. With the former Rural and Regional Development Management Program merging into this program starting in April 2018, the program contains rural and agricultural development as one of the key areas of focus. In addition to the basic subjects for economic development such as Development Economics, Development Macroeconomics, Development Microeconomics and Statistics/Econometrics, the EDP&M program offers the following focal areas while preparing students for their professional careers: Poverty-Growth-Inequality Triangle, Globalization and Development, Rural Economics and Development, Industrial Development, Tourism Economics and Development, Development Finance and Public Financial Management, among other related areas. In pursuing teaching and research in these key areas, the program stresses the importance of creating an optimal mix of ideas and concepts, theoretical frameworks, case studies, field work, and rigorous qualitative and quantitative analyses for us to support evidence-based policy making and execution. The EDP&M program also possesses a global network of development policy makers, practitioners and researchers consisting of our program alumni and collaborating researchers and practitioners, for us to tap into their accumulated knowledge and experience in managing economic development.

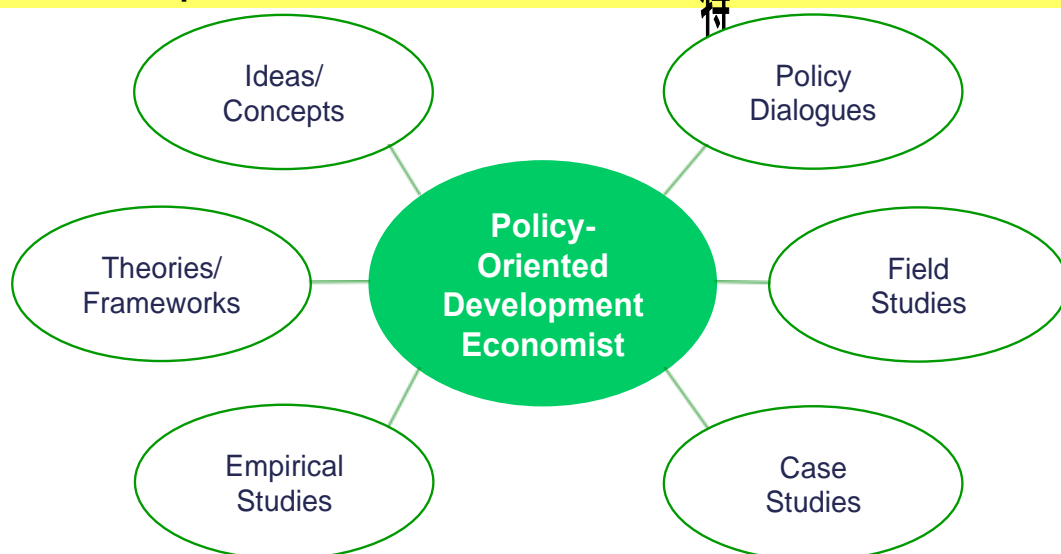

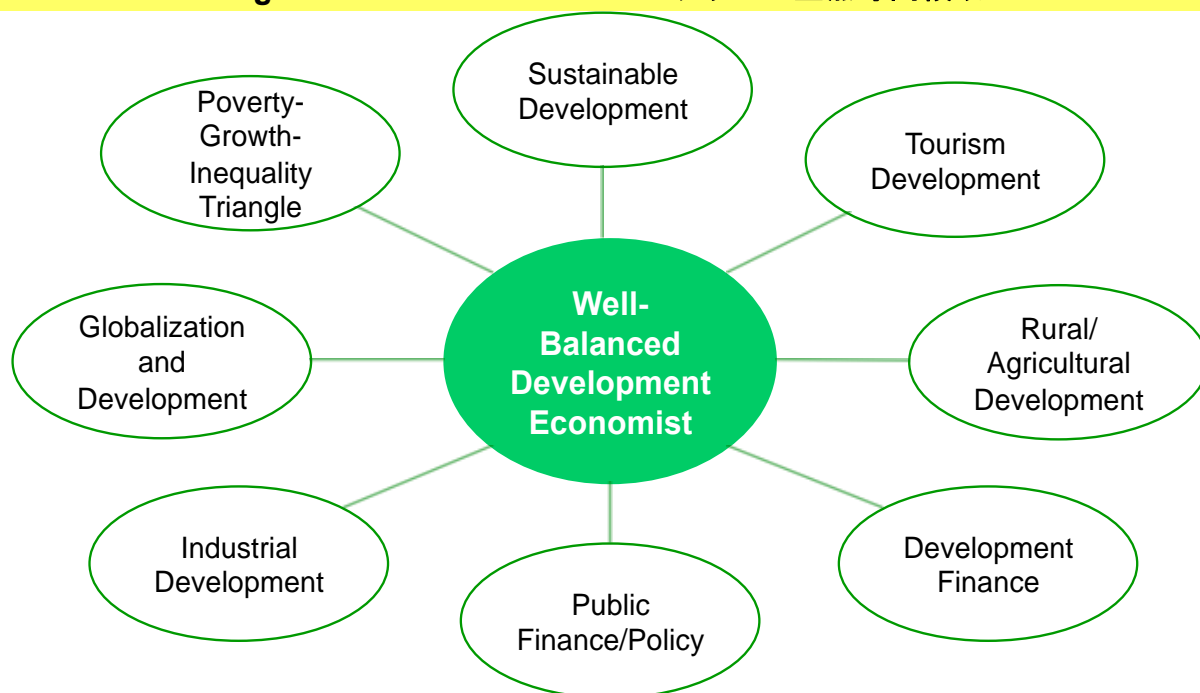

In Otsubo Seminar, frontiers of development studies and development public policies will be explored. 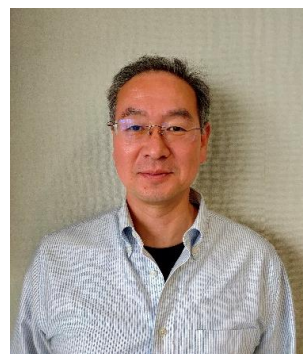

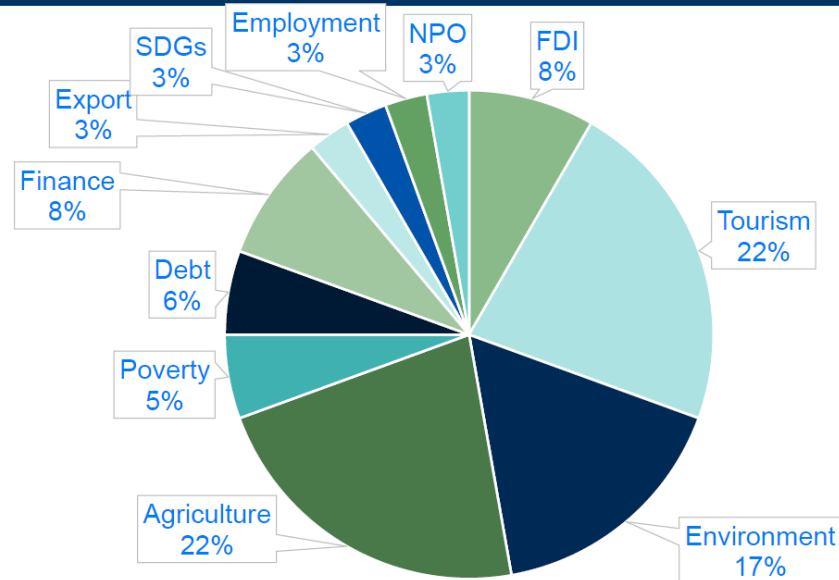

- 1) The basics of Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, and Statistics are the prerequisites for the Economic Development Policy and Management Program. Upon entry to the program, those who have not taken formal education in these subjects are required to take basic courses offered in the Faculty of Economics or elsewhere (Macroeconomics and/or Microeconomics). Those who have not acquired basic statistics, take Basic Statistics in the 'Basic Subjects Group B' in the program curriculum. However, other than this Basic Statistics, credits earned cannot be counted in the 30-credit requirement for graduation.
- 2) Subjects offered in the 'Program' s Core Applied Subjects' group represent the core subjects of the Program' s focal areas of teaching and research. It is required to select and obtain credits for more than two subjects (focal areas) from this group.
- 3) It is required to acquire more than 10 credits from the subjects in the 'Program' s Core Applied Subjects' and 'Program' s Other Applied Subjects' groups.
- 4) Among the Lectures/Seminars provided by School of Economics Cooperating Professors in the 'Program' s Other Applied Subjects' group, only lecture credits can be counted in the 30-credits requirement for graduation. The seminar credits cannot be counted in.
- 5) With the approvals of one' s main academic advisor and the program director, the credits from the subjects not included in the 'Program' s Other Applied Subjects' group—offered by the other programs of GSID, by the other faculties of Nagoya University, and by the faculties of the other universities with which GSID has signed credit transfer agreements—can be approved as credits toward the EDP&M program certificate and for graduation.
- 6) In the Year • Semester column, the timings of enrollment that the program expects for the subjects offered by the program' s core professors are shown. Actual selections and the sequencing of course enrollments should be made upon consultations with one' s academic advisor.

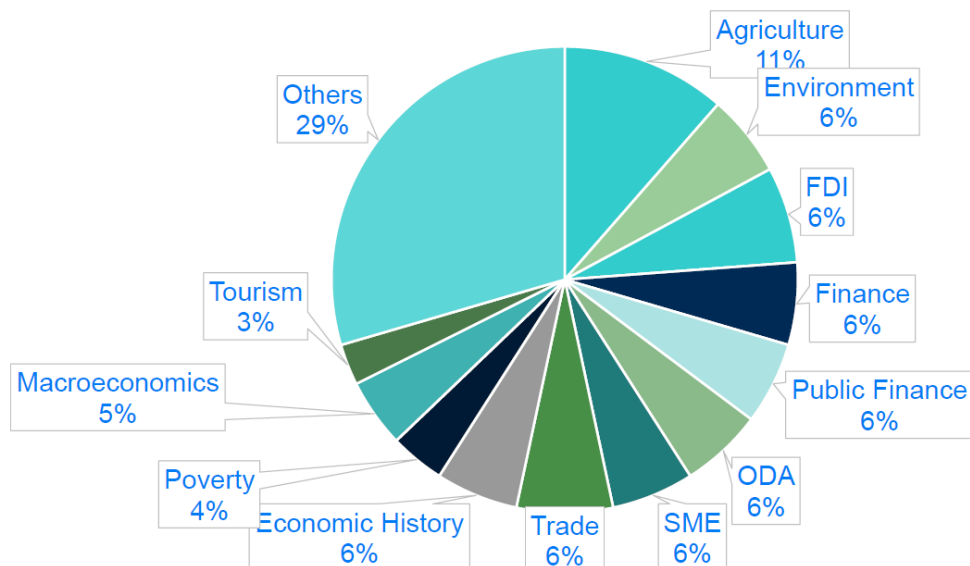
