The applicant is not required to specify one’s gender nor affix one’s photograph if one does not wish to do so.);</li> <li>2) a list of publications. (If an applicant has won any competitive research grants in the past, please mention them here with information on their size) ;</li> <li>3) copies of three publications (books or journal articles), including publications in English, if any;</li> <li>4) a short essay describing how an applicant wishes to conduct teaching and research activities at the Graduate School of International Development (in approximately 1200 words in English or 3000 characters in Japanese) ;</li> <li>5) a course syllabus for the fictional course entitled “Developing Countries and Poverty,” in both English and Japanese, each in one or two A4 pages.
