This notice shall be valid from April 1, 2021 until another notice is given.

## **Educational Activities**

#### (1) Lecture Courses

- In principle, lecture courses are conducted face-to-face, except for "Introduction to International Development," which is offered online.
- Lecture courses are offered simultaneously online through "Zoom," "Teams," or another platform as well as face-to-face for students who will not be able to come to the lecture rooms due to the COVID-19 or poor physical condition.
- When all the students and the lecturer agree, courses may be offered only through an online system. But they must be exceptional.
- Instructors are fully aware of some students participating in the lecture online.
- Online participants will be secured some time to ask questions.
- Students joining the course in the classroom must wear a mask.
- In case it is impossible to keep a social distance of one meter, a face-shield in addition to a face-mask must be put on.
- Be seated every other person. Do not take a seat with a notice "Do Not Use." Make sure that there are no people seated in front, back, left, or right.
- Every seat has its identification number or symbol. Students must put in the record the number of the seat they take, the course title or number, and the date and time. The document is vital to know if you have had close contact with an infected person of the novel coronavirus.
- Keep some (two or more) windows and doors open to ventilate.

#### (2) Seminars

• Seminars will be offered in the same way as lecture courses.

## Entrance into the GSID building

#### (1) Entrance to GSID

- Do not come to GSID when your temperature is 37.5 degrees Celsius or higher.
- · Avoid Three Cs within the GSID building. "Three Cs" means "Closed spaces," "Crowded places," and "Close-contact settings,"

- · Keep one meter-social distance.
- · Wear a mask always while staying in the GSID building.

## (2) Use of the Study Rooms

- Students can use their Study Room in GSID.
- Open at least two windows a little. If possible, the door is also to be open.
- In the Large Study Rooms, you are not allowed to occupy a desk with a notice "Do Not Use."
- · Keep quiet in the Study Rooms.
- Students are not allowed to take part in the online lectures or seminars in the Study Rooms.
- Students should go to a vacant seminar room to use it as a WiFi spot when they want to get supervision online.
- Students must put in the record when they come to and go out of the study room. The document is vital to know if you have had close contact with an infected person of the novel coronavirus.

#### (3) Supervision

• Supervision will be given face-to-face or online at the academic supervisor's discretion considering the student's needs.

### (4) WiFi Access Points

• Students who want to get academic advice online should have access to the Internet in a vacant seminar room.

## (5) Satellite Laboratory

• M2, D3 students, and other students who have special needs will be allowed to use a PC in the Satellite Laboratory during the period when an "IT supporter" is on duty. The GSID IT Committee announces the time to open the Satellite Laboratory.

## (6) Student Lounge on the 2nd Floor

• Please refrain from chats and discussions in the Student Lounge. Do not stay there for longer than 30 minutes.

#### (7) Room 205

• A microwave oven and a fridge are available in Room 205.

## (8) Where to Take Meals

• Take meals outdoors or in the Study Room.

### (9) Student Activities Other Than Research and Education

· Refrain from student activities other than research and education in the GSID building.

## Doctoral Degree Examination and Presentation

• D1, D2, and D3 presentation and the oral defense by doctoral students will be conducted online or in-person at the academic supervisor's discretion, considering the student's needs.

## Re: Course Delivery by On-demand Method

This is a notice about the Graduate School of International Development policy on the ondemand courses for which some students have submitted a request to the GSID Office. GSID has adopted the following policy as announced in *Notice from Dean of GSID: Anti-Coronavirus Measures in the Fall Semester* dated September 18, 2020.

- In principle, lecture courses are conducted face-to-face, except for "Japan's Development Experience," which is offered online.
- Lecture courses are also offered online through "Zoom," "Teams," or another platform as well as face-to-face because some students will not be able to come to the lecture rooms.
- Students are free to choose between face-to-face and online when participating in the classes.

Unlike undergraduate schools, GSID employs interactive course arrangements so that students can grow not by passively listening to one-sided lectures but by making presentations by themselves, answering questions from instructors, and asking questions to instructors and presenters. Therefore, we do not make videos of the lecture's courses available to students. It is because you need to participate in the class simultaneously as it is going on. Please understand this education policy of GSID, although it may be inconvenient for some students due to the time difference.

However, we do not prohibit instructors from making on-demand distribution of lectures and seminars. Our faculty members may distribute recorded lectures and seminars with courtesy in NUCT or other platforms. Therefore, if you have special needs, please consult with your lecturers. However, I would like to make clear that faculty members are not obliged to deliver their courses on demand.

Also, even if the lecturers of the classes that you take allow the on-demand delivery, your attendance must be face-to-face or online. Thus, when you try to take only the on-demand method, you may be treated as absent.

## **Educational Activities**

#### (1) Lecture Courses

- In principle, lecture courses are conducted face-to-face, except for "Japan's Development Experience," which is offered online.
- Lecture courses are also offered online through "Zoom," "Teams," or another platform as well as face-to-face because some students will not be able to come to the lecture rooms.
- Students are free to choose between face-to-face and online when participating in the classes.
- Instructors are fully aware of some students participating in the lecture online.
- Online participants will be secured some time to ask questions.
- Students joining the course in the classroom must wear a mask.
- Be seated every other person. Do not take a seat with a notice "Do Not Use." Make sure that there are no people seated in front, back, left, or right.
- Every seat has its identification number or symbol. Students must put in the record the number of the taken seat, the course title or number, and the date and time. The record is vital to know if you have had close contact with an infected person of the novel coronavirus.
- Keep some windows (two or more) and doors open to ventilate.

### (2) Seminars

• Seminars will be offered in the same way as lecture courses.

## Entrance into the GSID building

#### (1) Entrance to GSID

- It will be open from October 2. Do not come to GSID when your temperature is 37.5 degrees Celsius or higher. A thermometer will be supplied to every student with a manual on how to use it.
- · Avoid Three Cs (Closed spaces, Crowded places, and Close-contact settings) within the GSID building.
- · Wear a mask.

#### (2) Use of the Study Rooms

- · Students can use their Study Room in GSID.
- Open at least two windows a little. If possible, the door is also to be open.

- In the Large Study Rooms, you are not allowed to occupy a desk with a notice "Do Not Use."
- · Keep quiet in the Study Rooms.
- Students are not allowed to take part in the online lectures or seminars in the Study Rooms.
- Go to a vacant seminar room as a WiFi spot, when you want to get supervision online.
- Students must put in the record when you come to and go out of the study room. The record is vital to know if you have had close contact with an infected person of the novel coronavirus.

## (3) Supervision

• Supervision will be given face-to-face or online at the discretion of the academic supervisor considering the student's needs.

#### (4) WiFi Access Points

• Students who want to get academic advice by way of online should make access to the Internet in a vacant seminar room.

### (5) Satellite Laboratory

• M2, D3 students, and other students who have special needs will be allowed to use a PC in the Satellite Laboratory during the period when an "IT supporter" is on duty. The time to open the Satellite Laboratory is announced from the GSID IT Committee.

### (6) Student Lounge on the 2nd Floor

• Please refrain from chats and discussions in the Student Lounge. Do not stay there for longer than 30 minutes.

## (7) Room 205

• A microwave oven is available in Room 205.

## (8) Where to Take Meals

· Take meals outdoors or in the Study Room.

#### (9) Student Activities Other Than Research and Education

· Refrain from student activities other than research and education in the GSID building.

## Doctoral Degree Examination and Presentation

• D1, D2, and D3 presentation and the oral defense by doctoral students will be conducted either way online or in person at the discretion of the academic supervisor considering the student's needs.

## iii) To Students of Master's Program

By August 21 (Friday), take all belongings in the large study room to your home or move to some lecture rooms, which you can use as a temporary storage place. See the next page for details.

## 3. Individual Supervision

Supervision will be offered online in principle. However, your academic advisor may provide you with face-to-face supervision. You must follow the specific instruction given by your supervisor.

#### 4. Wifi Access Points

Students who take intensive lectures online will be allowed to take classes in a lecture or seminar room designated for the course by GSID course timetable if you have difficulty in accessing the Internet at home.

#### 5. Satellite Lab.

M2 or D3 students are permitted to use the Satellite Lab when an IT supporter is available there if you have a special need to do so for thesis writing.

## 6. Lounges On The 2nd And 3rd Floors

The use of those lounges is prohibited.

## 7. Student Activities Other Than Research And Education

Student activities other than research and education inside the GSID building are prohibited.

## **Supplementary Note on March 26 and April 8 Notifications**

## 1. Course Orientation from April 10 to 16

In accordance with the notice on March 26, course orientation will be held from April 10 to 16 as scheduled. Students should go to the classroom indicated in the GSID course timetable and inform the lecturer of their wishes to take the course. Students who are or were unable to come to the University must inform their intention to take the lecture course to the instructors of the lecture course by e-mail and supply necessary information of students, including name, student number, and university e-mail address. NUCT needs registration of students by the instructors. Students must make instructors aware of your wish to take the course by e-mail or by the attendance of the course guidance.

Therefore, what are requested to students to do during the period between April 10 and 16 are the following:

- (1) Decide which course you will take.
- (2) Get the information of instructors such as name and e-mail address (see 5 below).
- (3) Attend the course guidance or notify the instructors of your information, including name, student number, and university e-mail address by e-mail.

## 2. Seminars from April 10 to 16

Course guidance will also be held for the seminars under the notice on March 26. New students must attend the seminar guidance held at the room indicated in the GSID course timetable, like the course orientation shown above, and inform the lecturer as seminar conductor of their wishes to take the course, unless otherwise instructed by the instructor. Make sure that all the students are

required to get credits from the seminar given by your academic supervisor, who may be different from the tentative faculty advisor working for new students.

## 3. Lectures and Seminars after April 17

Lectures and seminars on and after April 17 must be taken at home, in principle, according to the notice on April 8.

## 4. Course Consultation

New students are given temporary faculty advisors. Contact your temporary faculty advisor by e-mail to get advice on which program to register for and which courses to take. You will receive a consultation by using e-mail, Zoom, or Skype. For the second-year students at the Master's program, please contact your academic supervisor by e-mail and receive consultation in the same way. After receiving the consultation, please obtain a confirmation of your academic supervisor and submit your course registration form by uploading to the designated NUSS from GSID Office.

## 5. Information of Instructors

The names of instructors of seminars and lectures are available at the GSID course timetable, syllabus, or Students Handbook. E-mail address of the instructors who are faculty members of GSID is available at the GSID website:

It may be necessary for students to get some information about instructors who are not faculty members of GSID. You should make an inquiry to the GSID Office about it.

## GSID policy of lectures and seminars

## 1. Distance education

- In principle, face-to-face classes will not be conducted according to the university-wide policy. It is provided by using NUCT, Zoom, and Skype.
- If your home, dormitory, apartment, etc. are in a Wi-fi environment, refrain from attending the university. Students are encouraged to study at home.

## 2. For students not in a Wi-fi environment

- If your home or apartment is not in such right circumstances as to make access to the Internet, you will be allowed to come to the lecture or seminar room specified in the GSID course timetable to access the internet using a wireless LAN, to participate in the class. Ventilate always in the room.
- Only those who take part in the timetable lesson should be present in the classroom so that they can speak to your friends and instructors if necessary.
- Instructors are connected from home or in their offices, so they are not in the classroom.
- Except for the purpose of taking classes, use of lecture room and seminar room is not allowed.

## For students who do not own any PC

- Be aware that class participation is possible with smartphones.
- You may participate in classes using the satellite laboratory on the 7<sup>th</sup> floor of GSID. In that case, seat every other person. Make sure other students are not around. Maximum occupancy is 12 people in the satellite laboratory. However, you will not be permitted to speak

because it may bother others. The chat function shall be used in NUCT or Zoom.

- 4. Study rooms in the GSID building.
- Refrain from using all the study rooms at GSID, in principle, including a graduate student council (Inseikai) room. It can only be used for a short period to take out or store necessary items. You can stay there within 10 minutes.
- · New students will not be assigned study rooms for the time being.
- 5. Lounges in the GSID building
- · Refrain from occupying any lounge at GSID even for a short period.
- 6. Social distancing
- · With other people, least 1. 8 meters must be spaced.
- In the case of the classroom where the above rule cannot be implemented, you must comply with every other person seated regulation.
- 7. The above measures are valid until further notice.
